GWRRA RIDER EDUCATION PROGRAM

GWRRA RIDER COURSES

All GWRRA Rider Courses are designed for Co-Rider participation also.


- ❖ **Advanced Rider Course (ARC) (8 hours)**
This course is designed to provide Riders and Co-Riders with the necessary skills and knowledge to make their riding experience safer and more enjoyable. It combines three (3) hours of classroom and five (5) hours of on-range riding skills, training and coaching. The course is all new while focusing on the critical skills of braking, cornering, and swerving.
- ❖ **Advanced Rider Course Recertification (ARC-R)** A range only version of the ARC. May only be used on an alternating basis with a full class that offers a classroom.
- ❖ **Trike Rider Course (TRC) (6 hours)**
This course is designed to provide Trike Riders with coaching and instruction focused on braking, cornering, and swerving. A unique experience for those on 3-wheels.
- ❖ **Trike Rider Course Recertification (TRC-R)**
See the ARC-R for an explanation.
- ❖ **Trailing Course (TC) (6 hours)**
With classroom and range instruction, this course prepares the rider for pulling a trailer. Includes discussions for set-up and on range practice for backing, braking, cornering, and swerving. Trailer required.
- ❖ **Trike Trailing Rider Course (TTRC) (6 hours)**
This course is a combination of the TRC and the TC. It provides Trike Riders with coaching and instruction focused on backing, braking, cornering, and swerving. Only GWRRA has it! Trailer required.
- ❖ **Sidecar Riders Course (SCR) (6 hours)**
Similar to the TRC and TC, this course emphasizes the handling differences specifically related to the Sidecar rig.
- ❖ **Add-on Kit Rider Course (AORC) (8 hours)**
This course is designed for the members who have added the 2-wheel "kits" to their motorcycles.
- ❖ **Other organizations offer Riding Courses that GWRRA accepts for use in the Levels Program.**

THE FOUR LEVELS OF THE RIDER EDUCATION PROGRAM




**Level I
Safety by Commitment**

You may sign up for the Rider Education Program's Level I at any time. There are no prerequisites or minimums to meet. Simply bring your commitment to make riding safer for yourself and those with whom you ride.




**Level II
Safety by Education**

To progress to this level, you must have signed on at Level I and achieved at least 5,000 safe riding miles since becoming a GWRRA member. Riders must have taken an approved Rider course within the last three years (Rider). Co-Riders must meet the same requirements with the substitution of a Co-Rider seminar or 2-Up Riding Course.



**Level III
Certified Rider/Co-Rider
Safety by Preparedness**

You must be current in Level II, have CPR or First Aid training certification and carry a First Aid Kit on the bike.



**Level IV
Master Tour Rider/Co-Rider
Safety by Enhanced
Preparedness & Experience**

You must be current and have a full year at Level III, have ridden at least 25,000 safe miles since joining GWRRA, have completed an approved Rider course within the past 3 years and must be certified in both CPR and First Aid. Co-Riders must meet the same requirements with the substitution of a Co-Rider seminar or 2-Up Riding Course.

Masters Recognition Program

Since 2002, this program continues to provide recognition for dedicated members who have maintained their commitment to the Rider Education Levels Program through their continued renewal as a Master Tour Rider.

Senior Master

Master Tour Riders who have maintained their active status by renewing for at least 5 consecutive years are eligible to be recognized as Senior Master Tour Rider.

Grand Master

Master Tour Riders who have maintained their active status by renewing for at least 10 consecutive years are eligible to be recognized as Grand Master Tour Rider.

Life Grand Master

Master Tour Riders who have maintained their active status by renewing for at least 15 consecutive years are eligible to be recognized as Life Grand Master Tour Rider.
